A quick recap of some of the goings-on with our organizations and community:

- The Fraternity and Sorority Community saw modest growth in recruitment numbers. Final Fall membership statistics will be calculated in early January.
- The fraternity and sorority community worked hard to develop more intentional partnerships with other groups on campus. Some of the efforts and accomplishments and included:
 - Starting off the Fall Semester with a joint retreat involving Student Government, the Student Events Team (programming board), and our own Fraternity & Sorority Life leadership.
 - o IFC and PHC officers chairing the planning committee for the sixth annual U-Lead Conference, a general leadership conference open to all students. The event was co-hosted by Fraternity & Sorority Life, Student Government, the Kearney International Center, the Residence Hall Association, Delta Sigma Pi, and our Leadership-U board.

- Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated, a historically Black fraternity continues to work towards achieving an independent charter for a chapter on campus.
- In Spring 2020, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, a historically Black sorority, intends to establish a chapter at Minnesota State Mankato.
- During the Weekend of February 29, Phi Delta Theta will be celebrating its 55th anniversary on campus.

HELP SUPPORT THE MARIE BRUCE AWARD

Previously, we have put out calls for support of the Marie Bruce Award. We are immensely thankful to the alumni and friends who have made gifts to further support this award, ensuring that it will be awarded for at least the next three years.

This award, the highest honor a member of our community can receive, is named after Marie Bruce, our university's former Dean of Women. She was instrumental in developing Fraternity & Sorority Life here. Recipients of this award have been benefitting from an endowment that was established at the time of Ms. Bruce's death. For several years, each recipient was awarded a \$250 scholarship. For the past two years, thanks to generous gifts, we were able to award two \$500 scholarships, and we plan to do the same this spring, or, hopefully, increase that amount.

Additional support is needed in order to continue awarding the scholarship beyond the next three years. Please reference "Marie Bruce-335020" when making your gift. There is an immediate need for contributions that can be awarded from the fund annually for the next 3-5 years.

As college costs have risen, the \$500 award we provide may not cover even the cost of a student's books for a semester. We would love to be able to increase this award to \$1000-1500 and be able to present it to one man and one woman perpetually. In order to reach that level, the scholarship endowment must increase by \$40,000-65,000.
