## Sigma Alpha Epsilon Returns To Campus

Many of the sororities and fraternities at Minnesota State University, Mankato have a long-standing tradition. This past year, Sigma Sigma Sigma and Phi Delta Theta celebrated huge milestones for their chapters. Although many of the organizations on campus have a rich history, the Greek Community always welcomes new or returning chapters to campus. This past year, Sigma Alpha Epsilon (SAE) returned to campus to rebuild their colony.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon, which had a chapter on campus from 1967-1975, has returned. One day Richard Cochran was leaving Carcoski Dining Hall, when he noticed someone tabling for Sigma Alpha Epsilon. He recognized the name of the fraternity because many of his friends are involved in SAE at the University of Minnesota. Richard, interested in starting an organization on campus, wanted to have similar experiences that he could share with his peers on campus. It was later that Richard approached the Coordinator of Expansion to learn more about the process of starting a fraternity on campus.

He learned, that in order to start a chapter on campus, you need more than 15 students with GPA's of 2.5 or higher. Richard shared that he did not feel like it would be a difficult task to find a group interested in joining him on this venture. However, after signing a few friends onto the challenge, they quickly realized how difficult it can be to recruit on campus. The newly formed SAE group faced difficulties having students take interest in their organization due to the strong Greek presence on campus.

SAE now currently has 17 colony members and they are looking to expand. Richard stated their goals for next year is to "recruit like crazy and continue to get our names out and about." John Bulcock shared, "we're glad to have them back!" The SAE colony members are currently working with area alumni to develop an advisory board.
