PRE-PODIATRIC MEDICINE & SURGERY

Pre-Podiatric Medicine and Surgery is a pre-professional advising track. Pre-professional tracks provide students with the intellectual and academic backgrounds they will need before continuing their education in degrees not offered at Minnesota State Mankato. Acceptance to professional educational institutions is contingent upon academic performance, so students enrolling in pre-professional tracks should be highly motivated and realize they are expected to maintain standards of excellence.

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

Pre-Podiatric Medicine & Surgery is a pre-professional advising track, not a degree program. The general requirement for admission to a college of podiatric medicine is a bachelor's degree. A few exceptional students are admitted with three years of college. All applicants are required to take the Medical College Admissions Test. Students are encouraged to contact the podiatric college or university they plan to attend during their second year in college. A minimum of 90 semester hours are required for admission to the College of Podiatric Medicine and Surgery. However, most students admitted to one of these colleges have completed undergraduate degrees.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Podiatric medicine is a branch of medicine devoted to the foot, ankle, and lower extremities. A Doctor of Podiatric Medicine (DPM) is a medical professional who diagnoses and treats foot, ankle, and lower leg conditions. Doctors of podiatry may perform surgery, complete medical histories, perform physical examinations, prescribe medications, set broken bones, treat sports-related injuries, and prescribe orthotics.

Advisors play an important role in guiding the students enrolled in such a plan of study so students are urged to contact their advisors before enrolling.
