

Step 4: Identify goal area classes that have and have not been prescribed by your department. For example, biomedical sciences require students to take BIOL 105 and CHEM 201, these classes satisfy goal area 3. However, they do not have specific goal area classes selected for goals 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, or 11. These are still classes you need to take, but you can select the classes yourself as electives. 1	English Composition: minimum of 1 course & 3 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Minimum grade of P or C Speech & Oral Reasoning: Minimum of 1 course & 3 credits	
2	Not required, but can be satisfied by completing the rest of a student's general education courses	
3	Minimum of six credits required from two different disciplines <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ One course must be a lab course

Academic success tips:



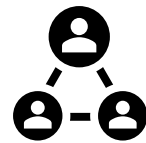
Get a PLANNER and time block when you are going to study, attend class, participate in extracurricular activities, and see family/friends.
